Thousands of young people help inspirational mental health charity

The six schools of The Priory Learning Trust (TPLT) are helping boost the mental health of thousands of 11 to 25year-olds in Somerset by supporting In Charley's Memory (ICM) as its official charity of the year.

ICM is a rapidly expanding charity which helps the mental wellbeing of hundreds of 11 to 25 year olds locally. It gives encouragement, training and ongoing counselling support for as long as needed.

ICM will now be helped by all schools in The Priory Learning Trust, just over five years since former The King Alfred School Academy teenager Charley Marks took his own life aged 18.

Neville Coles, Executive Principal of TPLT, said: "In Charley's Memory is a wonderful charity and we are so excited to be able to partner with it in this way. Last year we raised £20,000 for Weston Hospicecare and we hope this year to once again raise large amounts of money for a brilliant cause."





It was formed in 2014 by the mum of former TKASA student Charley who took his own life after years of







SMILE, WALK, BREATHE
