Dear Student

Welcome to the PCSA 14 Week Revision Plan!

Your teachers have put this plan together to help you to organise your revision. Having a plan is an essential part of effective revision. There are, of course, many topics to cover. However, there is still plenty of time and each subject can be broken down week by week into a bitesize chunk.

Please don't feel too daunted by the size of this booklet. It contains a lot of information! Start by crossing out the pages that cover subjects that don't apply to you. After that, remember that you only need to focus on one week at a time. Tick off each week as you cover it. If you start to give regular time to purposeful revision now, then you will find that as the weeks go by you will have covered lots of ground.

There are many ways of revising but one essential ingredient is planning your time. The back cover of this booklet shows an example of a weekly revision plan. You can collect copies of this in assemblies. Alternatively, you may wish to plan your revision in your own format or use an online planner like getrevising.co.uk. Whichever format you use for planning your time you will need to have a plan for when you are fitting your revision into each week and when you are covering each subject.

Remember that it is essential to take breaks and to find time each day when you can switch off and relax. A revision plan is not only an opportunity to plan your work but also a chance to plan when you will take time off. Revision is best approached in short bursts of approximately 30 minutes with short breaks in between.

You may be studying a course that is not included in this booklet. This is because this booklet covers mainly GCSE courses with exams in May and June. If you are also studying vocational courses your teachers will give you advice about the work you need to cover and when.

Finally, I wish you the best of luck with both your revision and your exams. There is lots of help available. Please ask your teachers if you are unsure about anything or require any resources, help or advice. Your hard work over the coming weeks will pay off with success in the summer.




#### When should I revise?

In order to revise effectively, you have to think hard. Thinking hard is tiring. Therefore, when you revise, you should choose a time when you find it easiest to focus. This should be a time when you're well rested and used to working.

Focus

Revising when you are tired:






Time

You should also take regular breaks when you revise. These breaks can be structured using a method called the Pomodoro technique.

Revising without a break:




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When revising:

Do:

...get into a routine of revising at a particular point every day ...revise when you are well rested or at a time when you are used to working ...take regular small breaks



Revising with small regular breaks:

Don't:

...depend on when you want to revise

...revise late at night or when you are tired

...try to force yourself to work for long periods of time without a break

#### Planning revision sessions using the Pomodoro Technique:

- 1. Choose a time when you are well rested and used to working
- 2. Decide the specific task you are going to complete, e.g. I will complete the Seneca module about electrolysis of aqueous substances
- 3. Set up your study area
- 4. Decide on how many 25 minute slots you will need to complete the task you have decided to complete
- 5. Remove your phone and any other distractions from your working space
- 6. Set a timer for 25 minutes. Ideally use a digital timer which is not on your phone
- 7. Spend the entire 25 minutes working. If you have spare time at the end, start another task
- 8. When the timer goes off, leave your working area and take a 5 minute break
- 9. Repeat. Take a longer break after three 25 minute sessions

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
